
## Fun Event to Raise Serious Funds for Serious Science

- the proven source of breakthroughs that advance new treatments while pushing toward prevention and a cure.


Over \$170 million for novel investigations in lupus over the past decade continues to demonstrate the power of innovation to achieve unsurpassed progress and documented results that directly impact patient care.

Novel investigations continue to define the scope and set the

pace for discovery and growth in lupus research. The LRI Novel Research Grant Recipients Class of 2014 is working from Florida to Seattle, from genetics to the human biology of lupus, to tackle lupus with new eyes, new questions, and creative new thinking. More than half of this year's investigators bring new concepts

from the frontiers of biology to bear on the problem of why the lupus immune system switches sides and begins attacking the body it is supposed to protect. Several other investigators are advancing new treatments for the most dangerous and debilitating complications of lupus.

Furie, Chief, Division of Rheumatology at North Shore LIJ Health System, noted there are not enough lupus patients enrolling in trials to test all the potential new treatments.
